framed botanical prints

1 Scan leaf clippings (we used ferns) and save the images as JPEGs. 2 Instead of cutting images away from the background, experiment with a photo-editing program like Microsoft Digital Image Pro (Mac users can use Adobe Photoshop Elements instead) to arrange them, whiten backgrounds and/or enhance leaf colours as desired. 3 Test-print the images on regular paper; if satisfied with the results, print onto printable fabric (we used Avery Printable Cotton), then frame.
